### About Rose of York Language School

Rose of York is located in the centre of London and offers students a rich cultural experience as well as providing stimulating, useful, authentic, fun and communicative lessons to help you develop and progress your English language learning.

Rose of York is an inviting and friendly school which has been providing excellent language tuition since it was established in 1989. Rose of York is accredited by the British Council and is a member of English UK.

### The Rose of York Team

All Rose of York staff must pass strict safeguarding checks, including the Children's Barred List and an Enhanced DBS (criminal record check). All staff have completed a course in Safeguarding and the welfare staff caring for your children also hold the Level 4 (formerly, the Advanced) Safeguarding Certificate.

We have a no-tolerance policy towards bullying and abusive behaviour. If any student feels that they are being bullied or they have seen someone being bullied, our specially trained welfare team are available to help.

Our support staff and student services officers keep a very close eye on student attendance. All Young Learners must attend 100% of their lessons; if they are more than 15 minutes late, we will contact them to find out where they are and why they are late. In case of an emergency, all students are given the emergency telephone number which is available 24-hours-a-day, 7-days-a-week.

# Young Learners' Programme



Our Young Learner courses are designed to help juniors (students aged 12 to 17 years old) practise and develop their English communication and language skills through a variety of fun and interesting activities. These courses can be tailored to meet the needs of specific groups and age ranges of students. In addition to classroom study, the programme includes a wide variety of activities such as games, competitions and day trips. Students will not only learn the language but also become more familiar with British culture through exploring places of interest in London and the surrounding areas.

## Course Aims:

- To develop students' knowledge of vocabulary, grammar and functional language.
- To focus on communicating effectively in a variety of relevant and engaging situations.
- Help students develop teamwork, independent study, communication and the ability to make international friends.
- Generate an interest in, and understanding of, British culture.

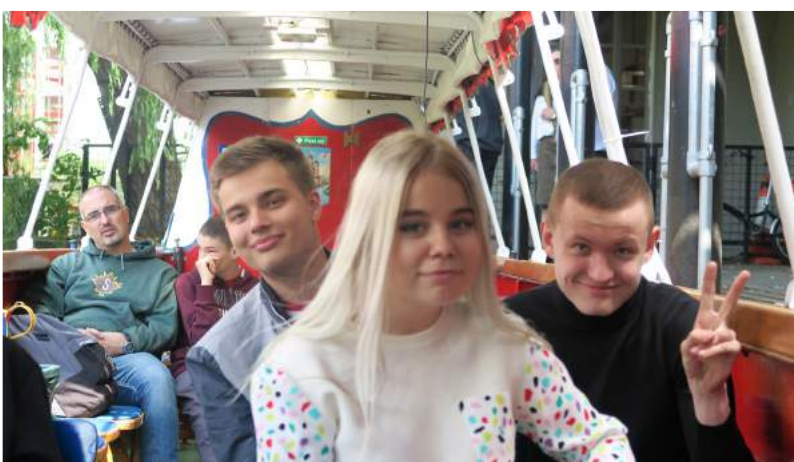

# Services

## Welfare

Your child's welfare is our top priority. Your child will be cared for by our dedicated support team, which includes host parents (if staying in homestay accommodation), teachers and activity leaders 24-hours-a-day, 7-days-a-week.

Depending on the age of the student, they have different rules which are strictly enforced:

## Accommodation



### Homestay

Your child can stay in safe and secure homestay accommodation with host families that have years of experience in welcoming young students. All homestay hosts (including all adults in the household) have also passed strict safeguarding checks including the Children's Barred List and an Enhanced DBS (criminal record check). Homestay accommodation is typically found in zones 1 to 4; Zone 4 is a quieter zone around London with excellent transport links to the city centre and to the school.



### Residence

Your child can stay in safe and secure residence accommodation, with 24-hour security and staff with many years of experience in welcoming young students and who have also passed strict safeguarding checks, including the Children's Barred List and an Enhanced DBS (criminal record check). Residence accommodation is situated between Zone 1 and Zone 4. Zone 4 is a quieter zone around London with excellent transport links to the city centre and to the school.



### Food

Students under 16 must stay in suitable accommodation on a Full-Board meal plan (with breakfast, dinner and a packed lunch provided every day). Your child will be offered a choice of nutritious food at each mealtime. Each meal will include a selection of hot and cold dishes including fresh fruit and vegetables.

\*Please note: Lunches are not included in the fees for students aged 16 and 17 unless it has been requested before booking. If your child/ward has not requested a Full-board meal plan, please understand that your child is responsible for buying lunch. You should ensure that your child has enough money to pay for lunches (£5-£8 per day).



## Travel

A member of our team will meet our Young Learner in the arrivals hall at the airport (if you request a taxi transfer) and will accompany them to their accommodation. On departure, our Young Learner is escorted to the check-in desk for their flight back home and the escort will remain at the airport until the flight departs in case of any problems.

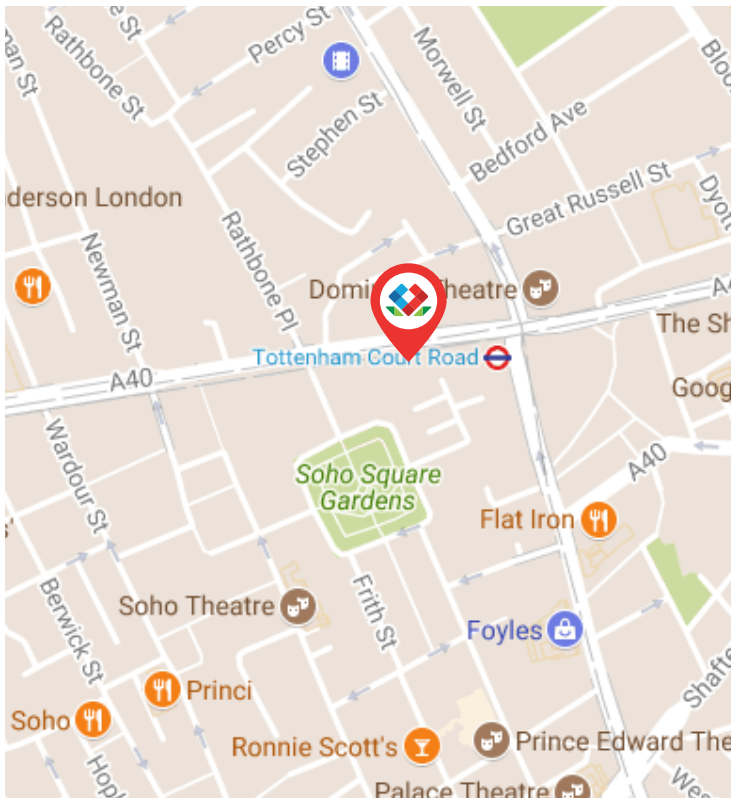
Students under 14 will always be accompanied on their way to and from school and will be supervised 24-hours-a-day. Students that are 14 or over are supervised at school and at home but are allowed to travel on their own to and from school with their parents' consent.



## Safety and Security

There is 24-hour CCTV operating throughout the school which is under surveillance by our security team. The entrance to the school remains locked throughout the day and visitors are never left unattended.
